



Seattle hiring heats up; rest of state shivers: With payrolls expanding in February and unemployment continuing to fall, it would appear that Washington's jobs picture is finally brightening. Except that for much of the state, it isn't. The jobs recovery that began in early 2010 has been overwhelmingly concentrated in the Greater Seattle area, analysis of the data released Tuesday by the state Employment Security Department shows. While the statewide unemployment rate held at 7.5 percent for the third straight month, that apparent stability masked a stark disparity between metro Seattle and the rest of the state.

Both counties improved from their January rates of 6.3 percent and 7.1 percent. That put them ahead of Whitman County, which in January had Washington's lowest rate of 5.8 percent but saw unemployment grow to 6.4 percent last month.



In Seattle, retail rose 6.8 percent to \$4.6 billion. Construction also rose a substantial 9.6 percent in that time frame.

The 28 acres sit between Microsoft's main campus and the Overlake shopping neighborhood. The site will be used to build 1.1 million square feet of office and retail space, more than 1,400 residential units and nearly 300 hotel rooms, Capstone said in a release. The project is a key element in the city's years-long effort to redevelop the nondescript downtown. Efforts to develop a nearby property with a massive mixed-use project have faltered. While the latest iteration of the Town Square project is technically still alive, the developer, Massachusetts-based Arcadd, has not come up with financing for the \$300 million project, city spokesman Chris Carrel said. The Los Angeles County Employees Retirement Association bought 605 Union Station and 625 Union Station from members of the McCaw family, public records show. Built in 2000, the five-building Union Station campus used to house Amazon.com Inc.. Today, Getty Images, Intel, Double Down Interactive and other tech companies lease space there. Vulcan Inc., Microsoft co-founder Paul Allen's company, also owns and occupies one of the five buildings, which are over the International District/Chinatown transit station.

Washington State Convention Center eyes Honda site for expansion: The <u>Washington State Convention Center</u> in downtown Seattle is eyeing a group of properties that — if acquired — would dramatically increase its footprint and its ability to host more and larger conventions. The convention center is "definitely" looking at the two acres around Boren Avenue and Olive Way occupied by Honda of Seattle, said <u>Jeff Blosser</u>, president and CEO of the convention center public facilities district, or PFD. The acquisition would give the PFD enough land to build a subterranean expansion across several square blocks. For years, the convention center has wanted to expand. The complex, located on Ninth Avenue and Howell Street, plans to house a 1,550 room hotel, 150 low-income housing, meeting space, and retail space. The original proposition included two towers but was redesigned to simplify the permitting process. 

China Shipping previously operated the service with two smaller vessels.

Over the past year, the local Consumer Price Index rose 1.76 percent, less than the national inflation rate of 2 percent, the Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Seattle-area gasoline prices rose 8.4 percent between December and February, including a 7.3 percent increase last month alone.




